The first time, part II: "I skied at Sun Valley right before Christmas the first year it opened. I took the train with the head mistress of my private school and another girl. A horse and buggy met us at the train station in Sun Valley. It was very glamorous."

Crash crush: "I met my late husband, Cameron Hall, in 1942 while we were skiing at Badger Pass. He skied over the front of my skis and I yelled at him. That's how we met."

Own private Idaho: "We bought a condo in Sun Valley in 1963 and then a house in 1983 because we needed more room for our three dogs."

Been there, done that: "I've seen a lot of changes in skiing—in the mountains, the equipment, the technique. I've probably been through 15 different ski techniques in my life."
