The Start, Part I "My father, grandfather and two uncles are all doctors, so I had a lot of exposure to medicine. And I knew nursing would be a career that would allow me to work anywhere."

The Start, Part II "I began spending my winters at Squaw Valley to get a break from the ICU. In 1987, I picked up extreme skier Dan Egan hitchhiking to the hill. I skied with him and his brother John and they said, 'Wow, a girl that can ski!' They helped me get started with photographers and filmmakers."

"A" Is For Athlete "I hate the label 'ski model.'
I've done shoots with real models and they don't
even know how to buckle their boots. I think of
myself more as a skier and an athlete."

Ups And Downs "The good side of what I do is traveling and skiing pristine powder before anyone else. But it's definitely not glamorous. You might have to hike 10 times to get one shot. And, 'one more time' really means at least three more times."
